Ed-Jew-Cation: Jews in the News

The world's oldest man, Holocaust survivor Yisrael Kristal, celebrated his bar mitzvah in October - 100 years late! Born in Poland in 1903, Kristal studied Hebrew and Jewish law as a youngster, but he missed his bar mitzvah because of World War I.

His daughter, Shulimath Kristal Kuperstoch, organized the ceremony in northern Israel, which about 60 friends and family attended. Following the bar mitzvah ceremony, attendants tossed candy at **Kristal...**a tradition commonly seen at bar mitzvahs for younger men, but the supercentenarian loved it, his daughter said (particularly because he is a retired confectioner!)

As a young man, Kristal married and had two children who died in the Lodz ghetto during WWII. He and his wife were sent to Auschwitz, where his wife died. Having survived the Holocaust, he moved to Israel with his second wife in 1950. He now has a large family of children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He was officially recognized as the world's oldest man by Guinness World Records in March 2016.

BOB DYLAN AWARDED NOBEL PRIZE IN LITERATURE

Singer-songwriter Bob Dylan (born Robert Allen Zimmerman) won the 2016 Nobel Prize in Literature on Thursday, a stunning announcement that for the first time bestowed the prestigious award on a musician for "having created new poetic expressions within the great American song tradition". Dylan, 75, "performs his poetry in the form of songs, that's no different from the ancient Greeks, whose works were often performed to music. Bob Dylan writes poetry for the ear", said the academy's secretary. (excerpted from Associated Press, by Karl Ritter)

Dylan is the 95th Jew to win the Nobel Prize, adding to the 22% of people of Jewish extraction to win the coveted award.

A lot of people talk about equality and about sacrifices to achieve it. A lot of people talk about the rights of Jewish kids with special needs to be exposed to everything Jewish, from Jewish holidays to education to respect.

We know of no two people who talk the talk and walk the walk so consistently, heroically, personally and profoundly as Dr. Stephen and Vicki Krausz.

Who volunteers to adopt more than one child — with Down syndrome? Who makes it possible for Jewish kids with profound special needs to find a place in a Jewish home? Who makes it possible for Jewish parents to adopt and embrace Jewish children with profound special needs? The Krauszes have done all these things.

Dr. Stephen and Vicki Krausz founded the Jewish Children's Adoption Network (JCAN) in 1990 to help locate Jewish parents for Jewish children, most of whom have special needs.

Their heroic journey **began this way. After having two "birth" children, the Krauszes wanted to expand their family, so they took in a little girl with special needs. Right around that time, Vicki became pregnant with their fourth child. Then their family kept growing as the Krauszes adopted two more children with special needs.**

Through the processes of adopting these children, the Krauszes became sensitive to the importance of Jewish children being placed with Jewish families. The Krauszes wanted to share their experiences and

passion to help children and prospective parents find each other. They developed a network of contacts and honed their expertise.

JCAN is not an adoption agency; the Krauszes consider themselves matchmakers. JCAN does not have a big budget; it runs on heart, energy, outreach, personal commitment and small donations. The Krauszes feel strongly about finding Jewish homes for Jewish children. Since 1990, Vicki and Steve **Krausz have “matched” more than 2,000 children!** — again, many with profound special needs — with Jewish parents just waiting to share their love.

*“Anyone who saves one Jewish soul, it is as if he has saved an entire **world**,”* says the Talmud. Did we mention? The Krauszes do not charge for their services. This is truly a *mitzvah*-driven couple, if ever there was one.

Now, they will move to Baltimore to be near their children and grandchildren.

The good news: The Krauszes will continue to operate JCAN in Baltimore.

We wish them every success in this new chapter in their dedicated lives.

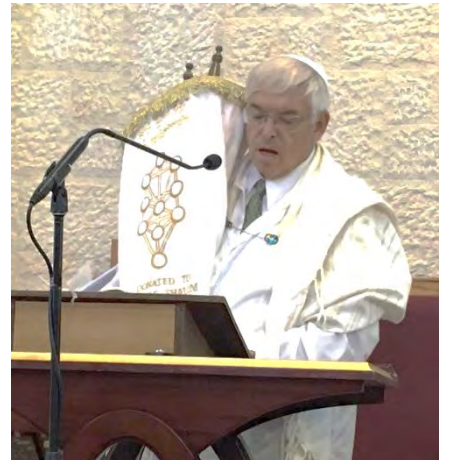

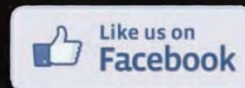
