Here is what Erv shared with me:

"The reason we have such a beautiful building and all its amenities is because of congregants' involvement and generous donations. There are many people who give large donations and want to remain anonymous for various reasons, but we want to thank them.

We recently asked congregants to donate to the Torah fund because our three Torahs are badly in need of repairs. Halfway through our campaign, we received a check for the remaining amount needed, and now we can fully pay for the repairs. What a wonderful gesture."

This is such a meaningful gift to Temple Shalom. Cleaning, repairing and koshering all three Torahs was one of my goals when I became President. **It's** gratifying to see this project come to fruition. Spring is here which means Passover to Jews throughout the world. Rabbi Barry H. Block says that on Passover, we are linked to Jews everywhere, as we all sit down to Seder tables on the same night. We recall that we have been slaves in many times and places since Egypt. We stand in awe of the fortitude of fellow Jews who have worked to set our people free from persecution throughout the ages. We acknowledge that we are the beneficiaries sacrifices made by our brothers and sisters in the Land of Israel. We rejoice in the freedom of our people.

Rabbi Block reminds us: **"Remember the stranger, for you were strangers in the Land of Egypt."** During Passover, we should be mindful of those who continue to be enslaved by poverty and hunger, by illness or by prejudice, by homelessness and by hopelessness. May you be inspired to another act of Tzedakah, to help the needy of our community. The Haggadah tells us that we are not truly free until all people live in liberty and peace.

Temple Shalom members enjoyed a lovely annual Seder on April 10, led by our Service Leader, Sheldon Skurow. The Hagaddah we shared with our members and their guests invoked the message of Rabbi Block. The organizers and readers did a great job. The many volunteers who contributed their time to plan and organize the Seder need to be thanked and appreciated. A special recognition to Ann Jasper and Rosalind Gantz.

The Sisterhood Women's Seder organized by Lynn Sindoris and Sherry Elias with an army of helpers and readers, was inspiring. The woman-centered Hagaddah empowered each of us. It was a wonderful experience, including dancing and singing orchestrated by Michelle Uss.

A unique Seder took place at the United Church of Christ (UCC), our neighbors on Route 101. The **Seder included the Interdenominational Committee. A wonderful experience that I've enjoyed for the past two years.** Thank you, Sheldon & Eveleen, for encouraging involvement.

May you and yours enjoy next year in Jerusalem, or wherever you gather to share a Seder.

Brett Bonda, the son of Dory Ratner, has been the Managing Director of the Richmond Ballet, The State Ballet of Virginia, since 2011. Brett joined the Ballet in 1985 as professional dancer and then founded the innovative education outreach program *Minds In Motion* (MIM) in 1994. MIM is the cornerstone of the Ballet's outreach efforts, with a goal of creating a more compassionate community through dance. In 2009, working with the Virginia Israel Advisory Board, he developed a MIM program in Israel, which works to use the power of dance to break down barriers between diverse communities. Students from Israeli and Arab schools work together to create a performance that is seen by audiences in both Israeli and Arab communities.

In honor of this extraordinary program, on March 27th, *Minds In Motion* received recognition from the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) for its work in uniting Jewish-Israeli and Arab-Israeli communities.

Ed-Jew-Cation: Power Mom

In the old days, our Yiddisher Mama could, and would, kvell (boast) about: my son, the doctor; my son, the lawyer; my son the rabbi. In the new days, our Jewish Mama can, and does, kvell about: My daughter, the doctor; my daughter, the lawyer; my daughter, the rabbi! Yes, same Mama, same children, **but now those original “Tiger Moms”** are looking to their daughters not only for grandchildren, but for Supreme Court Justices! Her son may be the prince, but her daughter is the ruling queen. Every year Forbes lists the 100 most powerful women in the world. For the past several years, over 10% of those women are Jewish, and they hold three of the top 10 rankings. Who are these marvelous, multi-tasking mothers?



#3 on that extraordinary list: JANET YELLEN, 71, wife of George Akerlof, mother of Robert Akerlof, Chairman of the U.S. Federal Reserve System since 2014. In charge of the management of American money policy, she is the highest ranking American on the Forbes list, and the first woman head of the Federal Reserve System. She holds a Ph.D in economics and is considered to be one of the 50 most influential economists and policymakers in the world.

#7 on Forbes list: SHERYL SANDBERG, 47, widow of the late David Goldberg, mother of two children, author, Chief Operating Officer of Facebook. Sheryl is also the founder of Leanin.org, which advocates that women lean in to positions of business leadership. Sheryl served as Chief of Staff for U.S. Sec. of the Treasury Sumner, and was the first woman to be selected for the Board of Directors at Facebook. Time Magazine named her as one of the most influential people in the world.

#8 on the exclusive list: SUSAN WOJCICKI, 48, married to Dennis Troper, mother of five children, CEO of YouTube. The founders of Google, Page and Brin (her ex brother-in-law), set up their original office in the Wojcicki garage in Menlo Park, and Susan was elected first marketing manager of that organization. In 2014 she became the CEO of Youtube, after handling its acquisition of that and Doublecheck. Ms. Wojcicki has been called the most important person in advertising and the most powerful woman on the internet. Family oriented, she is often quoted about finding the balance between family and career.

#20 is another technology related female: SAFRA CATZ, 55, married to Gal Tirosh, mother of two sons, **CEO of Oracle. She is said to be the world's highest paid female executive**, earning \$53.2 million in 2015. Ms. Catz is an Israeli-born American and retains much interest in her native land, calling Israel **“The Start-Up Nation.”** She was brought on board of Oracle in 1999 and has served as CFO and co-CEO. Her name has appeared on Forbes list since 2009.

23 and 24 are our superior Supreme Court justices, RUTH BADER GINSBURG and ELANA KAGAN. These two outstanding women are historically important both individually and jointly. Mrs. Ginsberg was the 2nd woman appointed to the U.S. Supreme Court and the first Jewish justice since Abe Fortas in 1969. A widow -- she was married to Martin Ginsburg and has two children. Ms. Kagan, only 56 years of age, was the first female solicitor general of the U.S., and has the distinction of being the fourth female justice. There is no record of her being married or having children, but she is female, and Jewish, and that counts!

#27; RUTH PORAT, 60, married to Anthony Paduano, mother of three children CFO of Alphabet, Inc. of which Google is a subsidiary. Before holding this lofty position, she was VP and CFO of Morgan Stanley for five years. Ms. Porat is a breast cancer survivor, which makes her extra-special.

All of those mentioned power moms were listed above Queen Elizabeth of England, who rated a #29 on Forbes list. Briefly, the following were among the 12 Jewish women named: #32; IRENE ROSENFELD, #60, CEO of Mondelez International, former CEO of Frito-Lay and Kraft Foods, married to Richard Illgen and mother of two daughters. Her philosophy is that she has a Jewish obligation to practice, **“Tikkun Olam,”** repairing the world. #47; BONNIE HAMMER, 66, Chairperson of NBC Universal Cable. She has been honored by many organizations for her initiatives and campaigns confronting racism and

bigotry through the use of the media. She is married to Dale Heussner and the mother of two children. #53; DANA FREEDMAN WALDEN, 53, Co-Chair and Co-CEO Fox Television Group, married and the mother of two children. **She was the person who negotiated the billion dollar deal to air "The Simpsons" on FXX, the most profitable show in syndication.** Coming in at #71; DIANE VON FURSTENBURG, (a true Jewish Princess, until her divorce from the prince), 70, wife of Barry Diller and mother of two (one of whom is a princess) CEO of her fashion company, DVF. She is most famous for her signature wrap-around dress and has diversified into other lines of fashion. Her mother, a Holocaust survivor, taught her, **"Fear is not an option!" In 2014 she pledged \$12 million to restore the Venice Jewish Ghetto and turn it into a Jewish cultural center.** Last of the group is #73; TORY BURCH, 50, married and mother of three sons and three stepdaughters, CEO of her own fashion design company Tory Burch LLC. She is **Jewish on her mother's side and says she embraces that heritage.** Once she commented: **"Clothes are not a religion. People don't think Diane Von Furstenburg's clothes are Jewish and my clothes aren't waspy!" This lady looks like and is worth one billion dollars!**

Considering that Jews make up about 2% of the world population (figuratively Jewish women are approximately 1% of the world population), to hold 12% of the positions on **the world's most powerful** women list, and 30% of the 10 top women on that list, is not shabby. It is a great beginning. As Bella Abzug, another powerhouse, once said: **"Women belong in the house.... The House of Representatives!"**

And to think that all but one of those women are wives and mothers, as well as chiefs. Undoubtedly, your mother was the most powerful woman you knew when you were a child, and your children thought the same about you. Your husband probably thinks you are the most powerful woman in his life, too! So to all the magnificent, multi-faceted mamas, doting aunts, loving sisters, and devoted daughters, **HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!**

Held on the 5th day of the calendar month Iyar, which is the first of May, Yom Ha'atzmaut is a modern holiday celebrating Israel's independence, which occurred in 1948. Israeli Independence Day is always immediately preceded by Yom Hazikaron; Memorial Day for the fallen Israeli soldiers. This message of linking these two days is clear: Israeli owes their independence, the very existence of the State, to the soldiers who sacrificed their lives for it.

For American Jews, celebrating Yom Ha'atzmaut has been a way to express solidarity with the State of Israel and to strengthen their alliance with it. In many communities, it is one of the few occasions in which Jewish organizations and synagogues of different ideologies and denominations cooperate in forming a common celebration. In many North American congregations, the joint public celebration often is augmented by a religious service. In many occasions the singing of Hatikvah follows the service.

Brothers coming together for a common cause can accomplish what some may say is the impossible. But we all know that working together for a common cause, such as our Temple, proves that nothing is impossible.

What's New in Israel?



The following news briefs were taken from *The Chronicle*, the community newspaper of the Jewish Council of North Central Florida, March 2017:

NEW GREAT POWER: “American Interest Magazine,” which each year lists “The Eight Great Powers in the World,” this year selected Israel as #8. It replaced Saudi Arabia on the list, because “Overall, the Jewish state continues to develop diplomatic, economic, and military power and to insert itself in the heart of regional politics.” Other factors mentioned were its offshore discoveries of natural gas and oil, good schools and talented thinkers and entrepreneurs, and the change in the balance of power in the Middle East.

AFGHANISTAN: One Jew Left: Though there were over 5,000 Jews in Afghanistan a hundred years ago, there is only one Jew left, Zebulon Simentov, who lives alone in Kabul. Simentov sells kosher meat and kebabs to the non-Jewish residents of Kabul. His wife and two children dwell in Israel.

ISRAELI BREATHALYZER: Israeli scientists have developed a breathalyzer technology for identifying 17 different diseases, including cancer and multiple sclerosis. The team claims an 86% success rate.

SOLAR EXPERIMENTS: Israel, already a leader in solar power, now is experimenting with the world's tallest solar towers (820 ft. high). When completed in the Negev within two years three towers will provide all the electricity needs for four or five cities the size of Gainesville, FL.

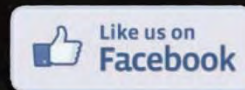

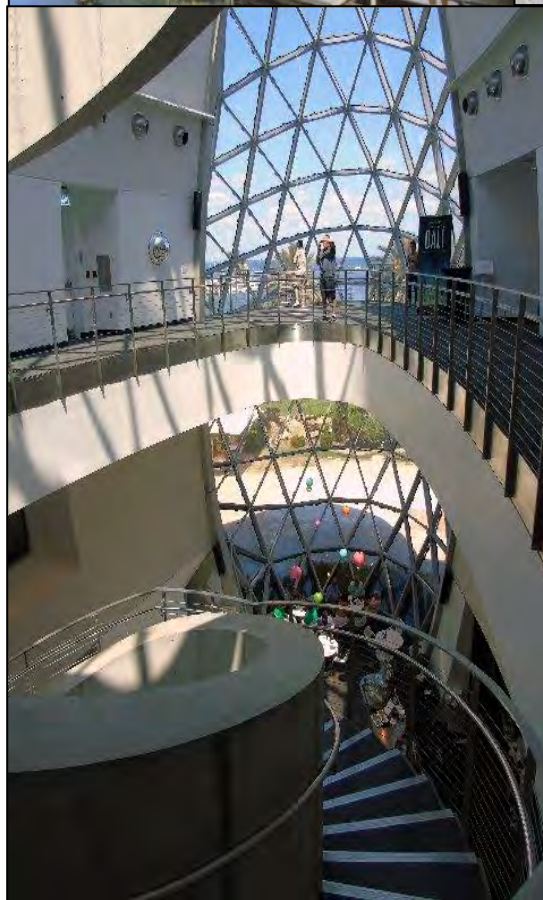
