





Prayer Hebrew Class - An exciting new class with Sara Branscome

Thursdays 2:00-3:15 p.m. starting January 28, 2016.

Students taking this class are expected to know how to read Hebrew. Emphasis in this class is on improving prayer fluency and the acquisition of basic prayer vocabulary. Participants will practice reading blessings/prayers, understand their meaning, recognize 200 important prayer words and 20 key roots. Participants will learn some tools for translating other prayer words.

<u>Hineni: Prayerbook Hebrew for Adults</u> will prepare adult learners for participation in Shabbat services. Adults acquire synagogue skills and gain confidence as they learn how to:

 Recite prayers as well as blessings for home rituals. (Blessings over candles, wine and challah at Shabbat dinner, ritual food items at Passover seder)
 Actively participate in the prayer service. (When we stand and when we sit during the service, why we rise up on our toes three times during the K'dushah)

Understand the meaning of the prayers. (How is the Sh'ma like a pledge of allegiance? Why do mourners recite the Kaddish, even though it does not mention death?)

Recognize 200 important prayer words and 20 key roots.

SPECIAL FEATURES: (We may not cover all the prayers in the book)

Recite prayers as well as blessings for home rituals. (Blessings over candles, wine, and challah at Shabbat dinner, ritual food items at Passover seder)

Actively participate in the prayer service. (When we stand and when we sit during the service, why we rise up on our toes three times during the K'dushah)

Understand the meaning of the prayers. (How is the Sh'ma like a pledge of allegiance? Why do mourners recite the Kaddish, even though it does not mention death?)

Recognize 200 important prayer words and 20 key roots.



ED-JEW-CATION: The Presence of Present

'Tis the season of Hanukkah, a minor religious holiday celebrated commercially with major gift giving! Ho! Ho! Ho! Historically there really is a connection between gift giving and Hanukkah that goes back to the time of the Maccabees and the Temple, and you may be surprised to know why.

According to the original story in the First and Second Books of the Maccabees, sacrifices were the gifts offered to God on the Temple altar. The Greeks were in power in Palestine at that time. Under King Antiochus, they decreed there would be no more sacrificial worship – only pagan Greek worship. To ensure this would occur, the Temple was defiled and theoretically destroyed by the Greeks. This really upset the Jews, especially Judah Maccabee who was like a Hebrew Rambo. An army gathered to overthrow the Greek rulers.

Well, you know the story...the ragtag Maccabean army shockingly won the rebellion and the Temple and its altar were restored; thus the festival of Hanukkah, which means rededication. Sacrifices resumed. The tiny bit of pure oil to light the lamps lasted eight days until more could be readied, yada yada yada – so we celebrate for eight days: eat, drink, and be very merry. (There was a war, we won, let's eat oily things!)

Oh yeah, what about the gifts? It's well known that Hebrew chieftains celebrated victory by bringing replacement presents for the sacrificial Tabernacle altar, including items used in facilitating sacrifice: silver bowls, basins, ladles. Ergo, a Hanukkah gift was a gift which enabled us to worship God. Finally, when the Temple was totally destroyed in 70 C.E., there was no holy altar, no sacrifices, and worshiping God shifted to study and prayer. The rabbis took a different slant on the holiday and centered the significance of Hanukah to the miracle of the oil and laws surrounding the lighting of the menorah. Forget the aifts!

Ah, but starting in the 18th century, the tradition of giving Hanukkah gelt (money) started. Historian Eliezer Segal suggests that families gave gelt to Hebrew and Talmud teachers during Hanukkah Torah study because otherwise teachers were not allowed to accept money for teaching Torah. It's conjectured that parents gave money to their kids to give to the teacher. Who knows? We weren't there. Maybe the kids thought they should get the money themselves for putting up with their teachers and studying so hard! Anyway, we had the connection between kids and gifts.

And so now you ask, why the particular gift of money? Well, going back to the original Hanukkah celebration of the winning back of the Temple, common war practice of victors was to take booty from the vanquished: weapons, horses and especially coins. The leader distributed these coins to his soldiers, the widows and orphans of the dead fighters, and if there was enough left, to the general population -- especially the children.

The coin was very symbolic. Victory over the Greeks enabled the Judeans to print their own coins with their own values and depictions on them. This was a freedom long denied them under foreign domination, and the Hasmoneans were quick to mint their own national coins. It's interesting to note that in 1958, the Bank of Israel issued commemorative coins for use as Hanukkah gelt which bore the image of the same menorah that appeared on the Maccabean coins 2,000 years ago.

Which brings us to chocolate gelt, the traditional sweet we give to children at Hanukkah. This supposedly started in Belgium in the early 1900s when Jews were involved in the making of chocolate. Geld (or gold) was given as part of the St. Nicolas holiday, and gentile children were gifted with the chocolate coins. Jewish families went along with that idea for their own holiday. In America, the Loft Candy Co. first produced chocolate gelt in the 1920s. The coins were wrapped in gold or silver foil and placed in mesh pouches that resembled money bags.

That has not changed much, except now most coins are manufactured in Israel. In our modern day, the giving of gelt is supposedly more to symbolize the tradition of giving charity to commemorate the Great Miracle of Light. Other kinds of presents like toys and clothing go along more with the spirit of Christmas, which, we know, is celebrated at approximately the same time of year as Hanukkah and is traditionally a time of gift giving. And yes, Virginia, there is a "Chanaclaus" in many Jewish American homes.

So if your family usually celebrates the festival of Hanukkah with the presence of presents, make it easy on yourself and just give the traditional gift of gelt. Or better yet, buy gift cards from Temple Shalom and make everybody happy!!! LATKES OF CHEERY

DON'T SEE PHOTOS - Some email providers don't show photos unless you click on the prompt "download photos", usually found upper left. If you still don't see photos, click on "View this email in your browser", usually found upper right.

MOVE AROUND - You can scroll up and down, use your PG Up and PgDn, or use your cursor to move the scroll bar on the right side of your screen to move through the SHALOM.

PARTIAL NEWSLETTER - Many email providers show only part of electronic newsletters.

At the bottom of what you see, click on the link that says something like "message clipped-see entire message" and the entire newsletter will appear.

CLICK HERE - Throughout the SHALOM, you'll see hot links to our temple website for more information. Just click and you'll be taken directly to the details you need. This method allows the SHALOM to include more information and reduces the redundancy of temple communications.

PHONE NUMBERS AND EMAIL ADDRESSES - Growing concerns over temple and member security led to a decision to keep personal phone numbers and email addresses out of communications that can be waylaid or misappropriated. Every member should have a temple directory which contains names, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses of officers, chairpersons, and members. If you haven't picked up your copy, stop in the temple office. Please use the directory - for everyone's safety.

PRINT IT - SHALOM is designed to be read as an email newsletter. A printable version in pdf format is available on our web site under the NEWS tab: www.tscfl.org For security reasons, you will need to call the temple office 352-748-1800 for the member password to the "members only" newsletterThen click to open the newsletter and print it - or print only the pages you need. SHALOM will be there every month (same password for photo section of the web site). You can print it directly from this email but it will be a lot of pages. It's best to print from the web site.
