Get to Know Your New SHALOM

Welcome to the new SHALOM, your monthly member newsletter. We think you'll enjoy scrolling through the articles, color photos, coming events, colorful notices, and advertisements whether you're at your computer, tablet or smart phone. SHALOM may look slightly different in various email providers and internet browsers. Content will be the same.

To help you, we offer these pointers:

NEED LARGER TYPE - You can make the newsletter type and photos larger or smaller. To make things larger, hold down your control key and hit the + (plus) key until the size is comfortable for you. To make them smaller, hold down your control key and hit the - (minus) key. If you have an APPLE/MAC computer, use the apple key and + or - . On your

smart phone, just use your fingers to expand/contract the size.

DON'T SEE PHOTOS - Some email providers don't show photos unless you click on the prompt "download photos", usually found upper left. If you still don't see photos, click on "View this email in your browser", usually found upper right.

MOVE AROUND - You can scroll up and down, use your PG Up and PgDn, or use your cursor to move the scroll bar on the right side of your screen to move through the SHALOM.

PARTIAL NEWSLETTER - Many email providers show only part of electronic newsletters. At the bottom of what you see, click on the link that says something like "message clipped - see entire message" and the entire newsletter will appear.

CLICK HERE - Throughout the SHALOM, you'll see hot links to our temple website for more information. Just click and you'll be taken directly to the details you need. This method allows the SHALOM to include more information and reduces the redundancy of temple communications.

PHONE NUMBERS AND EMAIL ADDRESSES - Growing concerns over temple and member security led to a decision to keep personal phone numbers and email addresses out of communications that can be waylaid or misappropriated. Every member should have a temple directory which contains names, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses of officers, chairpersons, and members. If you haven't picked up your copy, stop in the temple office. Please use the directory - for everyone's safety.

PRINT IT - SHALOM is designed to be read as an email newsletter. A printable version in pdf format is available on our web site under the NEWS tab: www.tscfl.org For security reasons, you will need to call the temple office 352-748-1800 for the member password to the "members only" newsletter. Then click to open the newsletter and print it - or print only the pages you need. SHALOM will be there every month (same password for photo section of the web site). You can print it directly from this email but it will be a lot of pages. It's best to print from the web site.

Information on how to submit articles and photos to the SHALOM is provided at the end of this newsletter.

Rabbi Search Committee Update

At the open congregational meeting on October 26, Rabbi Search Committee Chair Gerry Prezioso and President Steve Lowe reported that:

- based on guidelines established by the Rabbi Criteria Committee, the Search Committee has conducted SKYPE interviews with two potential candidates;
- both potential candidates have been invited to come for formal in-depth interviews with the Search Committee in November and December;
- if there is further interest in the candidate(s), a number of Search Committee members will visit the rabbi(s)' home congregations to observe a service and sermon, and references will be checked;
- the Committee continues to accept resumes.

There is no timeline to hire. The Rabbi Search Committee is committed to finding the best possible "fit" for our congregation. The process normally takes about 18 months.

ED-JEW-CATION: What's the Big Idea?

It is often said, "Necessity is the mother of invention". It is not often said, "Jewish women are the mothers of great inventors!" Jewish inventors have left their mark on the world over the years, with a

combination of creative thinking, hard work and adaptability, mostly because of necessity. It would take much too much space to catalog all the innovations in our lives that Jews developed. Here is a short list of 10 inventions by Jews that changed the world:

#10 LASERS: Actually, Albert Einstein established the foundation for lasers in 1917, but it was 1960 when the American physicist Theodore Maiman fired the first working laser. The Russian Jewish scientist Zhores Alperov won the Nobel Prize for physics in 2000. His work made it possible to transfer information from satellites down to earth - and to have so many telephone lines in cities.

#9 PACEMAKERS & DEFIBRILLATORS: Cardiologist Paul Zoll pioneered the development of these devices.

#8 GENETIC ENGINEERING: Paul Berg created the first recombinant DNA molecule in 1972

#7 STEEL: In 1893 Hans Goldschmidt developed the process that allowed scientists to create what is now stainless steel.

#6 MASS ENERGY EQUIVALENCE (E=MC²): Einstein, of course!

#5 CHOLERA & BUBONIC PLAGUE VACCINE: Even though in the 1300s Jews were blamed for the outbreaks, it took bacteriologist Waldeman Hoffkine to develop the preventive vaccine. He tested it on himself! He was knighted in 1893 as "a savior of humanity". The vaccine needle, as we know it, was invented by Benjamin Rubin.

#4 POLIO VACCINE: Australian biologist Karl Landsteiner identified the polio causative in 1908. Jonas Salk, the medical researcher, developed the first successful inactive polio vaccine. He refused to patent the vaccine, choosing to save lives rather than make a profit.

#3 NUCLEAR WEAPONRY: Robert Oppenheimer, theoretical physicist, is considered "the father of the atomic bomb". Later he lobbied against nuclear proliferation. His colleague, Edward Teller, developed the hydrogen bomb.

#2 CAPITALISM: When feudalism ended in the 15th century, capitalism rose. British political economist David Ricardo was a peer of Adam Smith's, and was the first to use the term "capitalism" in his writings in 1817.

#1 GOOGLE: Larry Page and Sergey Brin founded Google while they were students at Stanford. Their company's motto is "Don't be evil!" In 2011 the number of *monthly* visitors to Google.com surpassed one billion.

Some other nifty creations by Jewish inventors include: the ballpoint pen (Laszlo Biron 1938); Lasik eye surgery (Sam Blum); the shopping cart (grocer Sylvan Goldman 1940); the fax machine (Arthur Korn); lipstick tube (Maurice Levy 1915) and lip gloss (Max Factor 1930s); virtual reality (Jason Lanier in 1989), genetic engineering (Stanley Cohen 1973; instant photography (Edwin Land - Polaroid 1947); valium (Leo Stenbach); jeans (Levi Strauss 1883); video games (Ralph Baer); oral contraceptive pill (Gregory Pincus 1960); Rummikub game(Israeli Hertzano); Scotch-guard, Nescafe instant coffee, the Walkie-Talkie, LP records, the Flexstraw, and the TV remote control.

So take a moment at your Thanksgiving table to be grateful for your food, your family and friends, Temple Shalom, and all the things devised by your smart Jewish brethren that make your life easier and healthier. (You might also be thankful that you're not a turkey! Gobble, gobble!)
